The application shall minimally consist of an executive summary narrative (brevity is key) of the completed Vanguard tasks. Each narrative shall appropriately cross reference the respective Vanguard tasks that your Lodge completed. Copies of meeting notes, when not required by a requirement, can be included if deemed necessary.*

I Lodge Administration

B. Required Activities:

1. The Worshipful Master, Senior Warden, and Junior Warden must have successfully completed both of the Officer Leadership Training (OLT) classes 101 and 201 within the last five (5) years or have completed all of the Lodge Instruction for Effectiveness (L.I.F.E.) programs for JW (Introduction), SW (Operation), and WM (Administration). *Note: If only one OLT class has been completed, all L.I.F.E programs must be completed. Past Masters, although exempt per Article 276a, are not exempt with respect to the Vanguard Award.*
2. Form a Budget Committee consisting of the Worshipful Master, Senior Warden, Junior Warden, Treasurer, Secretary and create an Annual Lodge Operating Budget which contains, at minimum, the following items:
 - a) Income – Dues, Degree Fees, Fundraisers, Donations, Rent, etc.
 - b) Expenses – Grand Lodge Annual Returns, Utilities, Building Maintenance, Donations, Rent, Insurance, etc.

Note: The operating budget shall be presented to the Lodge within two-months of the Installation of Officers and documented in the Stated Meeting Notes.

3. Have the three principal officers (WM, SW, and JW) attend the Grand Annual Communication. Alternatively, have at least five members of the Lodge attend the Grand Annual Communication.
4. Form a Planning Committee consisting of the elected and appointed officers of the Lodge to identify at least three (3) short-term and three (3) long-term goals related to improving Lodge administration, membership, finances, facilities, and or community involvement. Next, compile a list of strategies and develop a task list and timeline to accomplish those goals.

B. Choose at Least Three Activities:

1. For each EA and FC who did not advance in the last two (2) years, investigate and determine why they failed to advance. Submit with the Vanguard Application a simplified report documenting the following: name of the EA or FC, why he failed to advance, and platform of communication to him (phone, letter, email, physical meeting). Document also the failed attempts (note: no more than two attempts should be made).
2. Bring a Brother Back: Plan a social event for your inactive local members (e.g., those who have not attended a Lodge function during the prior Masonic year and currently living within the jurisdiction of the Lodge). This could be a dinner at the Lodge or local restaurant, firearms event, sports game, etc. Submit with the Vanguard application a report describing the event, how the Lodge marketed the event, how the Lodge contacted the members and the attendance of the event. Describe the follow-up actions the Lodge plans to execute to reinforce the relationships that were re-connected.

If your Lodge hosted a speaker for the Bring a Brother Back program, document the meeting and the speaker and include in your application (this would satisfy the Vanguard credit).

3. Attempt to contact at least 20% of your inactive local members (those who have not attended a Lodge function during the prior Masonic year and currently living within the jurisdiction of the Lodge). Submit with the Vanguard application a simplified report documenting the following: member's name, platform of communication to him (phone, letter, email, physical meeting). Document also the failed attempts. *Note: no more than two attempts should be made.*
4. Have the Secretary (or other qualified member) attend a Secretary's School of Instruction. Provide appropriate documentation including Secretary's name and date and location of training.
5. Have the Treasurer (or other qualified member) attend a Treasurer's School of Instruction. Provide appropriate documentation including Treasurer's name and date and location of training.
6. Establish (or provide documentation of an active program) for one of the following "long-term" funding program opportunities for the Lodge. Note: these programs shall be separate from the general operations fund for the Lodge and shall be used exclusively for the purpose it was established. Document this plan and respective activities with a copy of the Stated Meeting Notes providing proof that it was discussed and approved by the Lodge members and signed by the Worshipful Master and attested by the Secretary. *Note: the goal for either option below is to initiate a long-term investment strategy which yields interest for the Lodge's benefit.*
 - a) Building Maintenance Fund
 - i. If the Lodge owns its building: investment income is to be used for building improvements, enhancements to the Lodge, regalia, furniture, or similar.
 - ii. If the Lodge rents the building (in part or whole): investment income is to be used for rent, the insurance premium, regalia, furniture, or similar.
 - b) Charity
 - iii. To be used for an approved Grand Lodge of Texas Charity Program such as scholarships.
 - c) Masonic Education
 - iv. Approved options: To start a masonic library or purchase books for the Lodge's masonic library, offset the expenses for speakers, graded degree(s), paying the expenses for officers to attend the Officers Leadership Program or other. Note: other alternatives can be approved.

II Community Involvement

1. Support public schools by participating in at least two (2) of the following:
 - a. "Take Time to Read" program.
 - b. Presenting "Mirabeau B. Lamar Awards" to deserving students and/or teachers at a public meeting or at the High School.
 - c. Participate in the "Fantastic Teeth" program.
 - d. Providing at least one \$500.00 college or trade school scholarship to a deserving High School Senior and present the award at an open meeting or at the High School of the recipient. Requirement: apply to the Texas Masonic Charities Foundation for matching funds to maximize the award(s).
 - e. Collecting/raising at least \$500.00 for needed school supplies as determined by a member of the local Elementary or Middle School faculty and administration.
 - f. Participate in the "Honesty and Integrity" program.

2. Support the young people of your area by doing one of the following:
 - a. Provide at least \$250.00 in financial support to a GLOT recognized masonic youth group (e.g., DeMolay or Rainbow Girls).
 - b. Provide at least one active advisor for a GLOT recognized Masonic youth group.
 - c. Host an Open Meeting to recognize an Eagle Scout.

A. Choose at Least Four Activities not Previously Selected:

1. Present a Community Builder Award at an Open Meeting.
2. Participate in at least one additional Grand Lodge Programs such as the "Gift of Life".
3. Allow the Lodge facility to be used for a public function or activity provided for under Article 224.
4. Host a Masonic information booth at a public event.
5. Participate in "Adopt-A-Highway" or similar public service activity.
6. Gather and distribute food, clothing, or other items for those in need.
7. Join with your City, County, or other public entity in a community event. Highlight the Lodge and the good deeds the Lodge has done and continues to do for the community.
8. Host the opening of a Representation of the Masonic Grand Lodge of Texas for the purpose of conducting a cornerstone ceremony or placing a grave marker for a Past Grand Master of the Masonic Grand Lodge of Texas.
9. Host an Open House for your Lodge.
10. Your Lodge to host an event for local veterans.

III Member Service

A. Required Activities:

1. Present all appropriate Grand Lodge Service Awards (i.e. 50, 60, etc. years' service) and all appropriate Lodge Service Awards (i.e., 25 and 40 year service) for the current Masonic year. Document if no members satisfied the requirements.
2. Assign a committee for the purpose of identifying a recipient of the "Golden Trowel Award" to a deserving member of the Lodge. Present the award in a ceremony appropriate for the occasion. Note: The Committee may determine there is not a current qualified candidate. If so, document as appropriate and Vanguard credit will still count.
3. Create or maintain a functioning website or social media page based upon criteria set by the GLOT Internet Committee.

B. Choose at Least Three Activities:

1. Host an Open Meeting focusing on the families and/or friends of your members such as a Bring a Friend program, Widow's program, Father/Son program, Father/Daughter program, Honor Your Wife/Sweetheart Program, Masonic Veterans Program, or a similar activity. Document as appropriate.
2. Formally acknowledge Masonic anniversary dates of Lodge members either during Stated Meetings, on a members-only Lodge web-site or social media page, or in the Lodge newsletter.
3. Host a Past Master's Event (tiled or an open meeting). It is encouraged that the Senior Warden provide a summary of his plans during his year in the East the following year. Coordinate with the District Communications Officer to expand the reach of communication.
4. The Lodge to plan for and execute an officer's retreat outing to discuss the plans for the Lodge during the year. Discussion topics could include goals, budget, fundraising, vision, etc.
5. The Lodge to attend and participate in masonic funerals. Minimum required members to attend = five (5). Alternatively, a member of the Lodge be considered qualified to be the funeral master and conduct at least one masonic burial.
6. Publish a monthly newsletter (minimally six (6) times per year).

IV Masonic Education

A. Required Activities:

1. The Worshipful Master, Senior Warden, and Junior Warden must be certified in ritualistic opening and closing (each one from all three positions) of all four Lodges. Certification must be done by either a member of the Committee on Work or a District Instructor. Note: The officer may satisfy this requirement by attending a Certificate Exam conducted by a member of the Committee on Work and qualifying for a "C" Certificate or better during the year in which the Lodge is applying for the Vanguard Award. Otherwise, they must be certified in a tiled Lodge by the District Instructor or a member of the Committee on Work and have the certification recorded in the minutes of the Lodge.
2. Present a topic from the Lodge Education Officer Program in at least four (4) Stated or Called meetings. Provide documentation of the programs offered by the Lodge Education Officer or his designee.

B. Choose at Least Three Activities:

1. Have at least one qualified officer (not including the WM, SW, or JW) attend and successfully complete one of the OLT classes (101 or 201) during this Masonic year.
2. Have your officers support your Masters, Wardens, and Secretaries, Association (MWSA) by accumulating at least nine (9) attendance credits at no less than three MWSA meetings. *Note: one voting member attending one meeting equals one attendance credit). Alternatively, have your officers participate in the formation or reactivation of a Masters, Wardens, and Secretaries Association.*
3. Have at least three members of your Lodge participate in your region's Masonic Service Bureau, or have at least one of your members visit a region which has a Masonic Service Bureau and attend a meeting.
4. Present at least two (2) Masonic education programs provided by the District Education Officer. The Lodge can host a guest speaker on one occasion to count toward the two (2) Masonic education programs. Speakers from appendant bodies is recommended, e.g., York Rite, Scottish Rite, etc. Coordinate with your District Communications Officer to expand the reach of communication.
5. Have at least one degree graded by the Committee on Work.
6. To promote fellowship, sharing, and education, arrange at least two get-togethers outside of the regular Stated Meeting for Master Masons to discuss a philosophic or symbolic topic related to Freemasonry. Coordinate with your District Communications Officer to expand your reach of communication.

V **Fraternalism**

A. Choose at Least four (4) Activities:

1. Have the top three officers attend the Briscoe Workshop. Alternatively, have at least five (5) members attend the Briscoe Workshop.
2. Have the top three officers attend the Spring Workshop. Alternatively, have at least five (5) members attend the Spring Workshop.
3. Promote fellowship by having a group of at least five (5) members attend the Stated Meeting of another Lodge in your District.
4. Host a Forum, or Forum and Certificate Exam by the Committee on Work.
5. Host (or schedule to host) a joint function between the Lodge and any Appendant Masonic body. Alternatively, be the hosting Lodge for the Texas Lodge of Research or Tranquility Lodge.
6. Host a quarterly social function for Lodge members, their families, and friends at a location other than the Lodge (Restaurant, Park, Waterpark, Sporting Event, etc.).
7. Host a quarterly social function for Lodge members, at a location other than the Lodge (Restaurant, Sporting Event, etc.).
8. Establish and/or continue to maintain a formal Mentorship program in your Lodge such as the "Pass it On" or "Membership Mentoring" programs, documenting each new EA and who is assigned as his Mentor.
9. Conduct at least one EA education night. Invite all EA's, FC's and MM's to attend a meeting where topics such as the EA obligation, EA lecture, basic Masonic philosophy, decorum or etiquette, or other EA topics are discussed.
10. Have at least three (3) of your members receive a Ritualist Certificate (either A, B, or C) from the Committee on Work.

VI Grand Master's Emphasis

The following items reinforce the Grand Master's masonic emphasis. No more than four (4) items can be used to replace a required activity expressed in Section I through V, above. Note: if a Grand Master's Emphasis is used to replace a Required Activity in Sections I through V, above, the point rating for the Grand Master's Emphasis can also be used in consideration to further compete and potentially be recognized as a "Top Five Lodge" at the 2023 Grand Communication.

1. Grand Master Conferences: Three of the five senior officers (WM, SW, JW, Treasurer, or Secretary) shall attend a conference. Alternatively, any combination of EAs, FCs, or members shall attend a conference for a total number of five (5) masons from your Lodge.
 - a. Total = 5 points
 - b. Total = 1 point (if at least one mason from your Lodge attends a Grand Master Conference)
 - c. Total = 10 points (if ten or more masons from your Lodge attend a Grand Master Conference). Note: Multiple conferences can be attended with each conference carrying the same weighted point coverage.

2. Alamo, Goliad, Gonzalez, or San Jacinto: Three of the five senior officers (WM, SW, JW, Treasurer, or Secretary) shall attend a historical observation. Alternatively, any combination of EAs, FCs, or members shall attend a historical observation for a total number of five (5) masons from your Lodge.
 - a. Total = 5 points for each historical location
 - b. Total = 1 point (if at least one mason from you Lodge attends a historical observation)
 - c. Total = 10 points (if ten or more masons from your Lodge attend a historical observation). Note: Multiple observances can be attended with each observance carrying the same weighted point coverage.

3. Lodge to host and lead a Lewis Night*
 - a. Total = 5 pointsNote: Called Meeting Notes shall reflect the program.

4. Lodge to host and lead a Fraternal Night*
 - a. Total = 5 pointsNote: Called Meeting Notes shall reflect the program.

5. Lodge to participate in a Practicing Freemasonry Program*
 - Cement Week* (total = 5 or 10 points)
 - Prayer Week* (total = 5 or 10 points)
 - Esoteric Week* (total = 5 or 10 points)

Note: at least three Brothers shall participate in one of the programs above to ascertain 5 points. If 5 or more Brothers participate, the Lodge can ascertain 10 points. The Brothers must report lessons learned or their experience to the lodge in a tiled meeting and the Stated Meeting notes shall reflect those Brother's names who participated. Also, a Lodge can participate in all three programs for a maximum capture of 30 points).

6. Lodge to participate in the “Brotherhood of Light” Program*
 - a. Total = 10 points
Note: at least three brothers shall participate. The Brothers must report lessons learned or their experience to the lodge in a tiled meeting and the Stated Meeting notes shall reflect those Brother’s names who participated.

7. Lodge (or Lodge Member) to develop and publish an article in the Texas Masonic Magazine, Texas History Committee, Short Talks, or other circular. *Note: the article does not have to be published during 2022, but must be approved (and documented) to be published in a future edition.*
 - a. Total = 15 points

8. Grand Lodge App: Eight (8) or more Brothers shall download and utilize the Grand Lodge App.
 - a. Total = 10 points

9. Past Master’s Apron: The Lodge shall purchase and present the “outgoing” Master with the Past Master Apron available at Grand Lodge; or a Past Master Apron shall be purchased by three or more Past Masters. All proceeds of this apron benefit the Grand Lodge of Texas
 - a. Total = 5 points
